INTRODUCTION TO FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY

ORIGINS OF FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY

THE ORIGINS OF FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY CAN BE TRACED BACK TO A VARIETY OF INFLUENCES, INCLUDING LEGAL, SOCIAL, AND PSYCHOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENTS.

THE EARLY FOUNDATIONS

IN ANCIENT CIVILIZATIONS, THE INTERSECTION OF LAW AND PSYCHOLOGY WAS RUDIMENTARY. LEGAL SYSTEMS WERE OFTEN BASED ON RELIGIOUS OR MORAL CODES, AND THE UNDERSTANDING OF HUMAN BEHAVIOR WAS LIMITED. HOWEVER, AS SOCIETIES

EVOLVED, SO DID THE NEED FOR A MORE SYSTEMATIC APPROACH TO UNDERSTANDING CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR.

DURING THE ENLIGHTENMENT PERIOD IN THE 18TH CENTURY, PHILOSOPHERS LIKE CESARE BECCARIA AND JEREMY BENTHAM BEGAN TO ADVOCATE FOR RATIONAL APPROACHES TO LAW AND PUNISHMENT. THEIR WORK LAID THE GROUNDWORK FOR MODERN CRIMINOLOGY AND THE UNDERSTANDING OF THE PSYCHOLOGICAL FACTORS INFLUENCING CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR.

THE BIRTH OF PSYCHOLOGICAL EVALUATION

THE LATE 19TH CENTURY MARKED A SIGNIFICANT TURNING POINT, WITH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY AS A SCIENTIFIC DISCIPLINE. FIGURES LIKE WILHELM WUNDT AND SIGMUND FREUD BROUGHT ATTENTION TO THE COMPLEXITIES OF HUMAN BEHAVIOR AND THE UNCONSCIOUS MIND. DEVELOPMENT THROUGH THE AGES

HIS BOOK, "ON THE WITNESS STAND," EXPLORED THE RELIABILITY OF EYEWITNESS TESTIMONY AND THE PSYCHOLOGICAL FACTORS THAT COULD INFLUENCE JURORS.

MID-20TH CENTURY ADVANCES

THE MID-20TH CENTURY MARKED A PERIOD OF RAPID EXPANSION FOR FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY. THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE AMERICAN PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION (APA) IN 1892 FACILITATED THE GROWTH OF PSYCHOLOGY AS A PROFESSION, AND BY THE 1960S, FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY BECAME MORE MAINSTREAM. PSYCHOLOGISTS BEGAN TO BE OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZED AS EXPERTS IN COURTS, PROVIDING VALUABLE INSIGHTS INTO CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR, COMPETENCY, AND INSANITY DEFENSES.

LATE 20TH CENTURY TO PRESENT

AS THE FIELD MATURED, FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY DIVERSIFIED INTO VARIOUS SPECIALIZED AREAS, INCLUDING CRIMINAL PROFILING, RISK ASSESSMENT, AND FAMILY LAW. THE INTRODUCTION OF NEW TECHNOLOGIES AND RESEARCH METHODOLOGIES, SUCH AS NEUROIMAGING AND COGNITIVE PSYCHOLOGY, HAS FURTHER ENRICHED THE FIELD.

HUGO M¹ NSTERBERG

M¹ NSTERBERG IS OFTEN REGARDED AS THE FATHER OF FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY. HIS WORK LAID THE FOUNDATION FOR APPLYING PSYCHOLOGICAL PRINCIPLES TO LEGAL ISSUES, PARTICULARLY REGARDING MEMORY AND TESTIMONY. HE EMPHASIZED THE NEED FOR SCIENTIFIC METHODS IN UNDERSTANDING HUMAN BEHAVIOR IN THE LEGAL CONTEXT.

WILLIAM MARSTON

ANOTHER INFLUENTIAL FIGURE, WILLIAM MARSTON, IS KNOWN FOR HIS CONTRIBUTIONS TO LIE DETECTION AND HIS INVENTION OF THE POLYGRAPH. HIS WORK IN THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY EXPLORED THE PSYCHOLOGICAL ASPECTS OF TRUTH-TELLING, WHICH HAS HAD LASTING IMPLICATIONS IN FORENSIC SETTINGS.

ELIZABETH LOFTUS

IN CONTEMPORARY TIMES, ELIZABETH LOFTUS HAS BEEN A LEADING RESEARCHER IN THE FIELD OF EYEWITNESS MEMORY. HER WORK HAS DEMONSTRATED HOW MEMORIES CAN BE MANIPULATED AND DISTORTED, RAISING CRITICAL QUESTIONS ABOUT THE RELIABILITY OF EYEWITNESS TESTIMONY IN LEGAL PROCEEDINGS.

THE DAUBERT STANDARD

IN 1993, THE SUPREME COURT CASE DAUBERT V. MERRELL DOW PHARMACEUTICALS SET A PRECEDENT FOR THE ADMISSIBILITY OF EXPERT TESTIMONY IN COURT. THE RULING ESTABLISHED THAT SCIENTIFIC EVIDENCE MUST BE RELEVANT AND RELIABLE, INFLUENCING HOW FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGISTS PRESENT THEIR FINDINGS IN LEGAL CONTEXTS.

MODERN APPLICATIONS OF FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY

TODAY, FORENSIC PSYCHOLOGY ENCOMPASSES A WIDE RANGE OF APPLICATIONS WITHIN THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM.
