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UNDERSTANDING DEJA VU

FOR INSTANCE, STANDING IN A QUIANT CAF[?] IN A FOREIGN CITY MIGHT TRIGGER

MEMORIES OF A SIMILAR CAFE VISITED YEARS AGO.

DEJA ENTENDU

DEJA ENTENDU, WHICH TRANSLATES TO "ALREADY HEARD," INVOLVES THE FEELING OF HAVING HEARD A CONVERSATION OR A PIECE OF MUSIC BEFORE. THIS TYPE OF DEJA VU CAN OCCUR IN SOCIAL SETTINGS OR DURING MEDIA CONSUMPTION, WHERE CERTAIN PHRASES OR MELODIES RESONATE WITH PAST EXPERIENCES, CREATING A SENSE OF FAMILIARITY.

DEJA RÊVÉ

DEJA RÊVÉ, OR "ALREADY DREAMED," REFERS TO THE SENSATION OF HAVING PREVIOUSLY DREAMED ABOUT A SITUATION CURRENTLY BEING EXPERIENCED. THIS CAN LEAD TO EERIE FEELINGS, AS INDIVIDUALS MAY RECALL DETAILS FROM DREAMS THAT SEEM TO ALIGN PERFECTLY WITH THEIR PRESENT REALITY. THIS INTERTWINING OF DREAMS AND REALITY CAN BE PARTICULARLY DISCONCERTING.

THEORIES BEHIND DEJA VU

NUMEROUS THEORIES HAVE BEEN PROPOSED TO EXPLAIN THE ENIGMATIC NATURE OF DEJA VU, EACH PROVIDING A DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVE ON WHY THIS PHENOMENON OCCURS. BELOW ARE SOME OF THE LEADING THEORIES IN PSYCHOLOGY AND NEUROSCIENCE.

NEUROLOGICAL PERSPECTIVES

NEUROLOGICALLY, DEJA VU HAS BEEN LINKED TO THE TEMPORAL LOBE OF THE BRAIN, AN AREA INVOLVED IN MEMORY PROCESSING. FURTHERMORE, STUDIES USING BRAIN IMAGING TECHNIQUES HAVE REVEALED THAT CERTAIN PATTERNS OF BRAIN ACTIVITY ARE ASSOCIATED WITH FEELINGS OF FAMILIARITY, INDICATING THAT DEJA VU MAY BE CONNECTED TO SPECIFIC NEURAL CIRCUITS.

COGNITIVE THEORIES

DEJA VU IN POPULAR CULTURE
